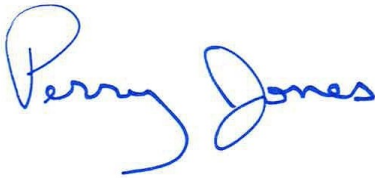
Dear Friends,

WHAT YOU PROVIDE

Emergency Services

Lost and broken men and women were invited inside, off the street, and received immediate care with meals, 24/7 shelter, restrooms, showers, and laundry facilities. Mission staff worked to develop relationships with guests and connect them to resources and services toward long-term solutions.



Medical Clinic

The Free Clinic continued to serve uninsured and under-insured men, women, and children faithfully. Patients were seen by healthcare professionals and provided with high quality medical assessments and referrals, acute and preventative care. Your support has meant so much to so many.



Learning Center

Men and women on Rescue Mission recovery programs visited the learning center daily working on an educational program tailored to their individual needs. It can include GED prep and computer literacy as well as resume/career assistance and training for trades such as HVAC and CDL licensing.



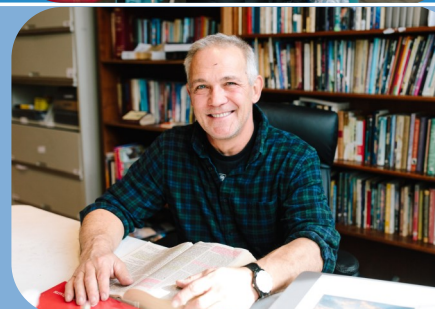
Clothing Center

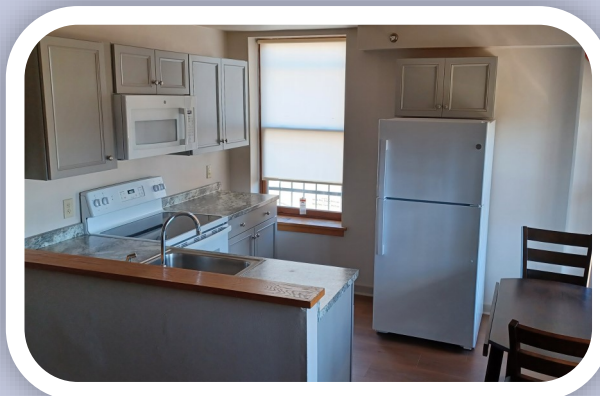


Women's Transitional Living Program

I grew up in a volatile household and suffered with mental health issues and depression. As a teen, I started smoking marijuana and cigarettes to cope with my emotions. When my parents kicked me out, I became homeless and spent time in juvenile detention. In 2021, I was pregnant and in an abusive relationship. I attempted suicide. I woke up in the hospital after an emergency C-section. My

baby was taken from me and put in foster care. I knew I needed help.

I was able to join the women's recovery program and my daughter came to live with me. It was amazing! I learned that God was with me from the beginning. I had never had a faith before, but I see that Jesus can heal. Now I have purpose and want to raise my daughter and help other young people. I am also going back to school to become an electrician. Thank you for supporting the Rescue Mission, it has changed my life!

As a child, I lived with my mom, but due to poor relationship choices, we often ended up homeless. I knew of God and early on I recognized that He gave me the gift of music. But I used it for my own glorification. I immersed myself in the music industry and began using drugs and alcohol regularly. I set out on a 1400 mile journey to follow my music dreams. I lived in my car until I lost it. I slept in abandoned buildings and on park

benches. I had no food or clothing. I finally cried out to God.

I followed the GPS on my phone and I walked to the Rescue Mission. I entered the New Life Program, had all my basic needs met and was able to dig in to God's Word and focus on Christ. My heart was softened. I was able to face my fears and learned to turn control over to the Lord. I finally had peace. I have recently graduated from the New Life Program and I now give back by doing devotions, serving in the chapel and helping in various other ways around the Mission. 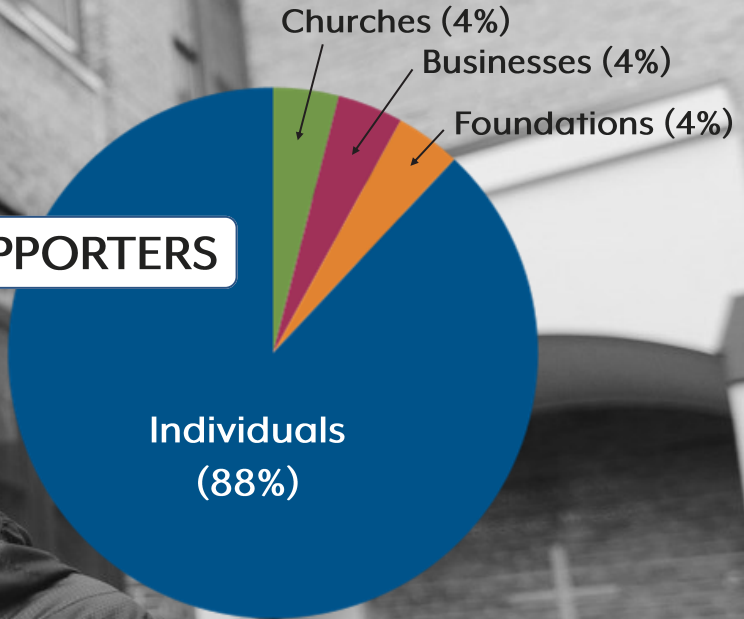

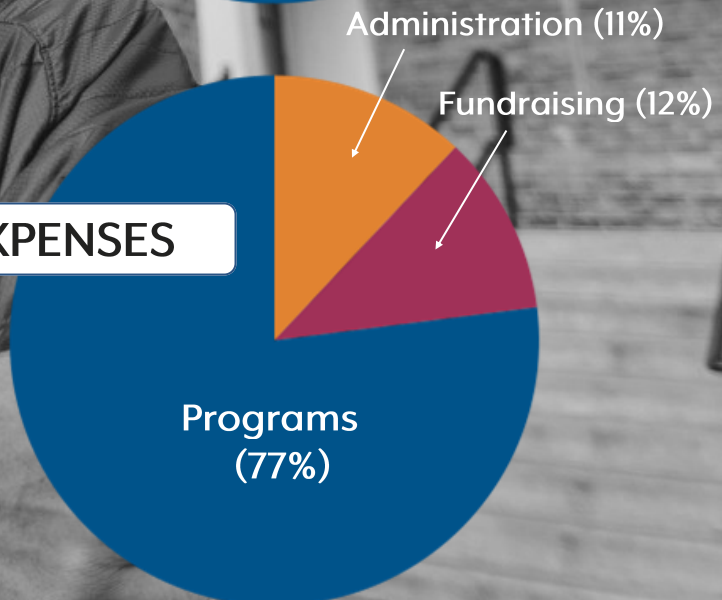
